The first time I read this script was long before there were conversations about who would direct it or how it would come to life. I was reading it simply for season consideration. I remember reaching the final lines and feeling instantly connected. Eboni Booth's beautiful script stirred something in me, and I knew then that I needed to find a way to put my name in the hat.

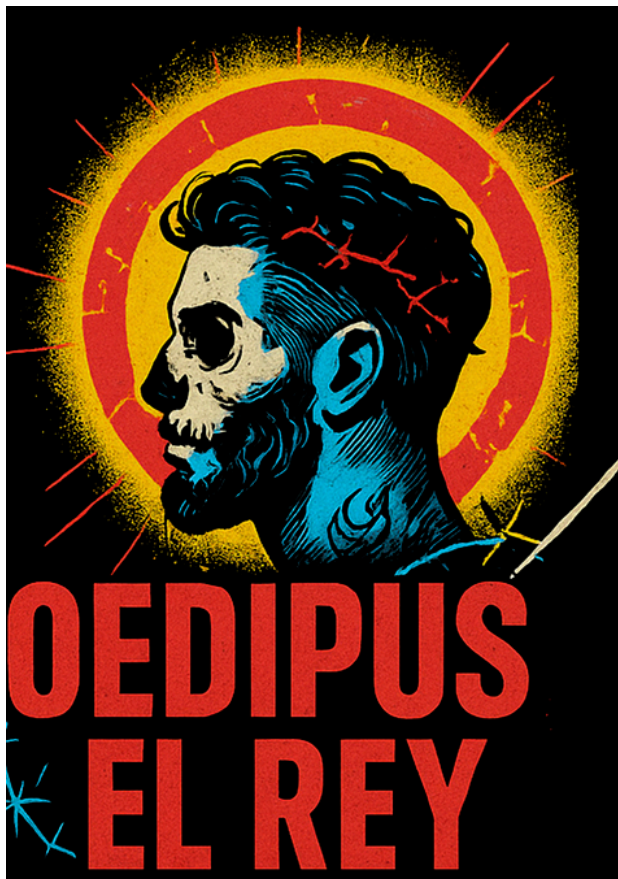

Based on Sophocles' classic tale, Oedipus El Rey is an urgent examination of modern institutions, social barriers and the power of storytelling for those bold enough to challenge the gods of our time.

Oedipus El Rey is published as part of The Greek Trilogy of Luis Alfaro. Based on Sophocles' Electra and Oedipus, and Euripides' Medea, Alfaro's Electricidad, Oedipus El Rey, and Mojada: A Medea in Los Angeles platform the concerns of the Chicano and wider Latino communities in Los Angeles and New York through ancient drama. Three Bone Theatre is proud to produce all three works of this trilogy across three seasons.

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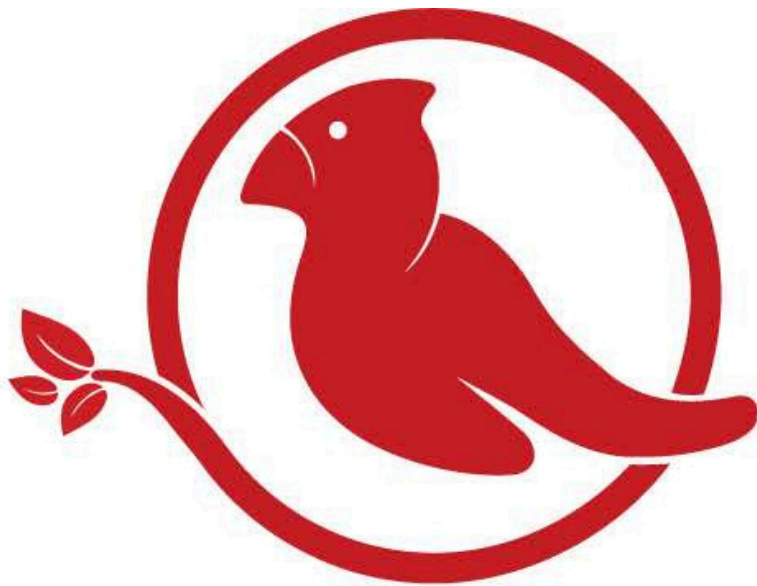
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CAROLINA NEW WORKS PLAY FESTIVAL

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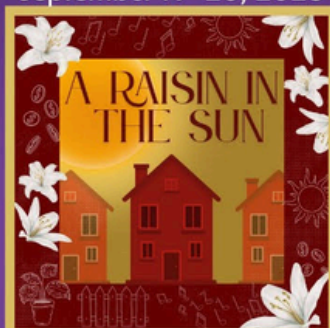
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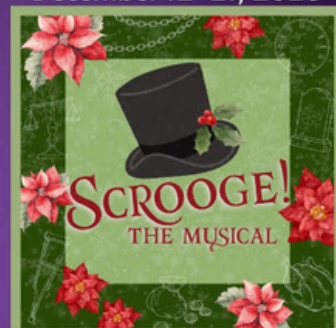
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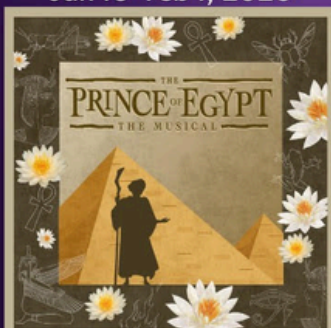
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
