

On Adventurous Theater Making and American Ambition

When Robin called me in the spring to ask me to direct "The Lehman Trilogy", I had several reactions.

First amazement - how did this emerging theater in Charlotte get the rights to one of the hottest theatrical properties in the country??? And how did I get so lucky as to get asked to direct?

Second, excitement. This is an incredible script, filled with propulsive poetry and huge ideas about ambition, capitalism, America, and what it means to be blessed. What a treat and a joy and a huge opportunity to get to dive into it!

And third - trepidation! This is a MASSIVE play, with three parts, spanning 150 years, in more than 40 locations. In its original production - and in every production to date - it has required the most cutting-edge stage technology, immense budgets, and a Broadway-level production. How could this tiny company at the Arts Factory pull this off?

All those feelings are what make this play so American.

America - as an experiment, as a nation, as a people - has been an unprecedented alchemy of outsize ambition and drive mixing with ridiculous opportunity and blessing. For 250 years, our country has grown and expanded and become something larger and more complex - more successful and more troubled - than any other nation on earth. It's amazing; it's exciting; it's more than a little bit scary.

This play follows one family, one immigrant family and the company they founded, on the insane thrill ride that American capitalism is and continues to be. Throughout this story, you will see moments when the Lehman family makes astounding leaps - from shop keepers to merchants to bankers to power brokers to global titans - almost without making a misstep. You will see them survive and thrive where so many others failed. And in those moments, I hope you will see yourself and our country.

America - even today, even amongst our challenges - means something. It stands for something. It's story is a testament to what human beings can achieve with their dreams. Forgive me for being pollyannaish - but I still believe that America has been and continues to be a force for good in the world.

But that good comes at a cost, and this play - this epic, sprawling, 3-hour roller coaster - asks us to grapple with our role in paying that cost. What responsibility comes with the rights and blessings we have been given?

All of my initial feelings of awe, joy and fear have been ratified in the making of this play. We've been awed, we've been excited, we've definitely been scared. I want to say thank you to Robin, Becky and the Three Bone Theatre team for the opportunity. I want to thank our tireless cast, designers and crew for throwing everything they have into this tilt at the windmill.

And I want to thank you, our brave audience, for coming to share in this experience. To share what it means to be ambitious and to aim high. To share what happens when we succeed and when we fail. And to share in what it means to be American.
